From Our Rabbi

The holiday of Shavuot teaches us an important lesson. Shavuot is the celebration connected to receiving the commandments at Mt. Sinai. In the Torah we read, “And God said to us at Mount Sinai, ‘Today you stand before Me, all of you... stand before Me to enter into this covenant. And I make this covenant not with you alone, but both with those of you who are standing before me today and with those who are not with us here today.’” Every person throughout time stood together, experiencing the revelation of God's Torah.



Tradition teaches that this common experience of our pasts links us together in a unique way. Since we all stood together, we are all connected as one community. Rabbi Alex Greenbaum writes, "Sinai means that we are all, all part of the congregation of Israel, young and old, man and woman, rich and poor, observant and unobservant." All of us were there, at Sinai. All of us are equal participants in the Jewish community.

But we can take this teaching further. Because we each stood at Sinai and received the gift of Torah, each of us is able to play an active role in the interpretation of Torah. Each of us is capable of understanding the text - we bring the Torah around the congregation when we read from it because it is not meant to be something out of reach. Each of us is able to own Jewish tradition, adding our unique threads to the tapestry.

This is one of the biggest gifts of Judaism: the power of each person to raise his or her voice as an important contributor to the interpretation and application of scripture, history, and values. Jews don't need an intermediary to access these, we are all teachers as we are all learners. Indeed, it is our responsibility to learn from each and every voice we encounter, not just those who have studied the text. Together, we are a community of thinkers, questioners, and storytellers who value listening to one another and learning from all.

May this holiday of Shavuot remind us of our commitment to being lifelong learners and lifelong teachers.
